Our main funder, The City of The Hague, does not seem to recognise the platform that we developed since 2002. They don't seem to value the strength of our community, partners, collaborators and co-funders; neither understanding our efforts to connect with the rest of the world in order to sustain our platform for talent, creativity and innovation for almost 2 decades.

The Dutch Ministry of Culture was very positive in their evaluations, but there was not enough budget for institutes in The Hague, as the current policy is to support more initiatives outside of the big cities.

We have a lot of energy and are not afraid of challenges, but the current pandemic hangs as a second dark cloud over our heads. If we loose our funding now, we will not be able to survive and we will need to submerge...



I've rewritten this a dozen times because there's so much to say about TodaysArt and keeping everything concise is a monumental task unto itself. Do I talk about the music and how it has been at the forefront of booking interesting AND forward thinking artists? Do I talk about the various installations that take cutting edge technology and make the experience of that accessible to the average person? Do I talk about art that pushes boundaries? Do I talk about the panel discussions and conversations allowing for deeper conversations on these topics? Or do I point out how TodaysArt is special in that it manages to find the intersection of all these things and create an experience well beyond the individual parts? All of these things deserve all the acclaim that anyone familiar with TodaysArt can give to it. But I'm going to attempt to say something different, to speak to the impact that TodaysArt has had and continues to have.

My name is Cornelius Harris, a US citizen, but also a resident of Earth. In these days of a global pandemic, I think now, more than ever, it is important for us to think and consider our collective role in being permanent residents of this planet. TodaysArt was founded and based in Den Haag, but it has hosted artists, musicians, engineers, designers, technologists, and many others from across the planet. These individuals come not only as the creatives that their titles suggest, but as cultural ambassadors who come to share and inspire the people of the Netherlands, each other, and beyond. Every September for years, Den Haag has been both a stage and canvas, where science and art isn't limited to a single space, but across the city center. It's where we are able to see and experience our commonalities and come together in ways that aren't as common as they should be. TodaysArt has inspired collaborations between culture and technology workers in different nations, but TodaysArt and Den Haag remains the birthplace of those collaborations. And so TodaysArt impacts not just Den Haag, but the world.

On a personal level I will also confess that TodaysArt has had such an impact on me that I traveled to Den Haag on more than one occasion NOT as a participant in the festival, but as an attendee and volunteer. It has deepened my understanding of the possibilities of working across national borders and inspired me on how culture, technology, and art are not only able to work together, but are related, reflections of each other. I've gained colleagues and friends who share a love of a better world with art and culture leading the way. And I, in turn, have been inspired to share that inspiration with people in Detroit, where I'm based, and everywhere else in the world I have traveled.

I have no idea what kind of stresses the city of Den Haag is going through in the midst of this pandemic, but I do know one thing. TodaysArt is a diamond in the city's crown and it would be a tragedy to see it gone.



As strange as it may sound to some, having in mind cultural and artistic institutions and festivals even with a much longer existence, TodaysArt is one of the most important European cultural institutions. The way in which contemporary art and artists are treated at this festival is an example from which a bunch of others, very often nothing but pretentious and commercial festivals, should and must learn. That this is really the case is best shown by the influence, results and reputation that this festival has on a European and world scale. With its organization and human resources, this festival goes beyond its own framework and represents one of the foundations of European contemporary culture embodied in the We Are Europe festival group. The cessation of funding for TodaysArt festival would be a shot in its own foot of the Dutch Ministry of Culture, with a clear indication that they are not aware of the importance of such an institution for the presentation of Dutch culture, as well as support, maintenance and promotion of contemporary European artistic thought and practice. Or in other words - that they are not up to the task they should perform in these difficult times for European festival culture. Although I am deeply aware that the voice of one man from the Balkans (which means that I am very used to a lot of nonsense that politics and politicians do), no matter how much he was a doctor of science and the initiator of prestigious European projects in culture, science and education, cannot mean much to the administration of a European country - I raise my voice and join the commune that has gathered here with the aim of trying to bring the importance of continuing funding to this festival to the people who should be aware of it first, by the very fact that they occupy the administrative positions they hold.

Electronic music, digital based visual arts, and works which combine these 2 fields have in the last 20 years become a world wide, multi-million euro industry and Holland has without question become one of the most (if not the most) important proponents for this burgeoning industry in Europe, which despite the pandemic gives every indication of exponential growth far into the future. As a result of this, many large multi-national corporate players from the fashion, food and beverage, and even energy industries have begun investing heavily in large scale electronic music events and the merchandising associated with said events. While on a surface level this may seem like a good thing for the industry as a whole, the reality couldn't be further from the truth, as curatorial decisions become increasingly driven by perceived potential ticket sales and non-organic social media followers which are often bought by the same companies or associated shell companies investing in the events in the first place. TodaysArt, along with the other members of the International Cities of Advanced Sound network provide a crucial platform for electronic music and digital arts which is driven by the merit of the work being showcased. There is no question that some of the events programmed at these crucial festivals will be under attended and very well may lose money. But as TodaysArt's own Tshirt said last year, these same people will be tomorrows headliners. It has been my great pleasure to play for TodaysArt several times over the last 2 decades and it is my great hope I will be able to do so for many years to come. I would implore those persons responsible for the festival's continued funding at a municipal level to recognize the incredible contribution Olaf and the entire team have made not just to your city, not just to your country, but indeed to the world as a whole, and hundreds of young artists who, like me so many years ago, were so empowered by the invitation to come and perform in a loving environment surrounded by our heroes and peers. 

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

christopher_salter Today's Art is an essential part of the cultural ecology of experimental and innovative art, not only in The Hague but internationally. The ground for newer initiatives like Grey Space in the Middle and Instrument Inventors was only made possible because of the artistic foresight of the Today's Art team over the past decades - much like the similar cultural ecology that arose in the experimental dance scene in Frankfurt Germany in the mid 1990s-2000s because of the Frankfurt Ballet and William Forsythe's vision. Without strong and lasting initiatives like Today's Art to anchor newer projects, The Hague itself would lose its international reputation as a centre of new cultural expression. And despite the sense that Today's Art is a Dutch specific festival, as someone from Montreal Canada, I can attest that TA's influence is also felt strongly in Quebec based on the many long term projects and partnerships that have been forged between TA and Montreal's international music, media and performance scenes. Especially in times that we experiencing, short sidedness thinks to cultural expression first on the chopping block but it's important to remember that for most people around the globe in the last nine months, new kinds of cultural expression and imaginaries have been the only thing that have kept people going.






